## SOCIAL MEDIA COMPETITION


Got a great pic to share?! Have a photo that perfectly displays our Club at its best?! Well now you could win something for those moments!

The inaugural Sonning HC vs Bicester HC Charity HOCaKEY OFF (a Hockey & Bake-off to raise money for Hockey 4 Heroes, a charity supporting British servicemen and women) hosted by us! Before the main event (the cakes, obviously), there was the small matter of a Mixed Hockey match between the sides. As well as pride and bragging rights, the triumphant team would take valuable points into the bake-off.



As you might well imagine, the game was well contested from the start with both sides putting together some nice passing moves. However, it proved to be a moment of individual skill from Sonning forward Colm Hanlon which broke the deadlock. That first goal proved to be key and as the half wore on Sonning exerted control on the game stretching their lead to 4-0. After the break, with the fog really closing in, Bicester came back into the game, but the Sonning defence led by Mai-Po Wan and Ned Squire restricted Bicester to few

opportunities and those they did create were well saved by young goalkeeper Mitch Miller. Sonning continued to be a threat in front of goal through Sammy Petch and Noel Plant and added one more to their tally before the end of that match to round off a comfortable win... the cake would be another matter however...!

Having worked up a suitable appetite, attention turned to the Bake-off. However, before the teams could taste for themselves, we welcomed guest judges Lucy Rowe and Tim Preston from England Hockey. With the crowds looking nervous, the judges, understanding the magnitude of the occasion (this is serious stuff), meticulously scrutinised ten cakes (one from each of five different bakers from each team). The cakes were scored on appearance, taste, and texture. After an agonising wait, the teams were set to discover their fate...



Lead judge, Lucy, announced the 3rd, 2nd, and 1st placed cakes; 2nd and 3rd being taken by Bicester to bring them right back into the competition, but 1st going to Sonning (well done Julie Barclay, winner of the original Sonning HC bake-off showing that she is a true champion baker) to surely keep them in a strong position. So, what of the overall result... the scores from all five cakes, plus the points gained from Sonning's victory in the hockey would determine the club which had won overall... Bicester 331... Sonning 350!

As Sonning were crowned champions, all the participants tucked into the cake. As both clubs had agreed to give all proceeds to Hockey 4 Heroes, and as Berkshire County Sports Club kindly donated use of the pitch, we were able to raise more than £450! As the dust (and our stomachs) settled, organisers Colm Hanlon and Becca Clark from Sonning, and Chris Birch from Bicester reflected on a very successful day. Well, Becca and Colm reflected on their success and Chris was clearly plotting his revenge, because as Thank You's were exchanged between all the parties, Chris challenged Sonning HC to a rematch... this time it would be in Bicester, and we would be baking pies...!


Our Under 8's had a great tournament, showing good team work & skills, which meant they were unbeaten!!

## KNOCKOUT COMPETITIONS

MEN'S 1s - Men's Vase

It was a busy November for the Men's 1s, with their first match of the Vase, and then knocked out of the competition within one week of each other!

22<sup>nd</sup> November vs Bicester – Won 4-2 (James Lockhart)

Bicester had just 11 players along for the ride, and they came out hard and fast, clearly hoping to take an early lead and defend on the half court. Bicester struck first, with a quick break, a penalty corner, & failing to clear the GK pads after the initial shot was saved. 0-1.



Sonning's frustration was evident straight from the resulting push-back, as they scored straight away with a clipped shot top-left from Mark Dobbie at the top of the circle. 1-1. Sonning were back in the game and started knocking the ball about, dominating possession, but still unable to take a chance. They were made to pay for their casual play, as Bicester re-took the lead. 1-2.

Sonning once again used this to spur them on, & just before the half time whistle, won a penalty corner that Tom Sampson converted coolly to equalize once again for his 4th goal of year. 2-2.

In the 2<sup>nd</sup> half, Ian Gallagher won, then converted a penalty stroke after being illegally impeded by the Bicester keeper. 3-2. Then just before the full-time whistle David Painter, who latched onto a long ball from the halfway line, in behind the Bicester back-line, deflected from near the top of the circle. 4-2.

29<sup>th</sup> November vs Trinity Mid-Whitgiftian – Lost 1-2 (James Lockhart)

Sonning were given a torrid opening 10 minutes and eventually succumbed, with poor marking coupled with some good skill by their opponents seeing them down 0-1 fairly early in the game.

They equalised not long after, when a crash ball into the Trinity circle found a defenders foot, with the resulting penalty corner despatched by Ian Gallagher, who tucked away a crisp reverse strike. However, their equal footing didn't last long, as around the 20 minute mark




Trinity struck again, with some individual skill at a penalty corner giving Allan little chance in goal. 1-2.

Trinity's keeper then made one good save in the latter stages of the half to keep his side in the lead, and at the other end Allan was called upon to keep Sonning in the contest on a couple of occasions, but the second half finished without major incident. 1-2 it remained.

Sonning spent the [2<sup>nd</sup>] half moving the ball fairly well, but lacking bite up front to find an equaliser. One late chance fell to David Painter but his deflection whistled agonisingly wide. In the end, Sonning will be disappointed with a defeat, but it was probably a fair reflection of the match as their efforts fell just short against strong opponents.

After the break, spurred on by the inspirational words of Captain Adam 'Mac' McCarthy, Vice-Captain Jamie Haworth, and still being cheered on by their faithful supporters from the sideline, Sonning once again came out in spirited fashion, with Colm Hanlon even managing to successfully execute a clean tackle

(which he celebrated more wildly than most people celebrate a goal). "Remember what happened in the Japan game" everyone was thinking... Unfortunately Sonning couldn't match the heroics of Japan and, despite dogged defence led by centre backs Jordan Manning and Ben Johnson, Surbiton further extended their lead. Sonning had chances of their own to get on the scoresheet, but a combination of committed cover defending and good goalkeeping prevented Noel 'Santa' Plant from applying the finishing touch to some good counter-attacking plays.

In the end Surbiton ran out convincing 9-0 winners, but Sonning gave a performance they can be proud of and despite the scoreline both sets of players, as well as the match officials, left the pitch congratulating each other on a very enjoyable match.


